

Hidden in the Pineywoods of East Texas is Tyler State Park, a popular retreat developed in the 1930s by the Civilian Conservation Corps. Heavily wooded hills surround a 63-acre private lake, the park's centerpiece that accommodates fishing and swimming, as well as canoes and slow-moving boats. Foot trails circle the lake, and mountain bikers will enjoy the challenging bike trails.

-  **Camping:** Campsites with water only, water and electricity, or full hookups with 50-amp service and sewer are available. Screened shelters are available for those without tents or RVs.
-  **Group Facilities:** Group camp with electricity and pavilion (capacity 50). Group picnic area without shelter. Amphitheater. Dining hall (capacity 100).
-  **Picnicking:** Day-use area with picnic tables and grills.
-  **Swimming:** Swimming beach.
-  **Fishing:** Fishing piers. Possible catches include largemouth bass and catfish.
-  **Boating:** Five miles per hour only—no wakes permitted. Boat ramp and dock. Also canoeing.
-  **Trails:** Short hiking and nature trails. 8.5-mile mountain-bike trail.
-  **Texas State Parks Store:** The park store offers a wide variety of souvenirs, bait, snacks, ice, and crafted products. Relax on the patio or use the free Wi-Fi connection. Boats available to rent.



Located in Smith County, eight miles north of Tyler on F.M. 14 and two miles north of I-20.



Open year round. Self-pay station available for after-hours visitors. Park superintendent/law enforcement in residence on site.
